

Gender Audit

The Gender Audit at Yashoda College of Architecture focuses on promoting gender equality by challenging traditional gender norms and fostering an inclusive environment for both men and women. The audit revealed that the college actively ensures gender balance through equal representation in student enrollment and staff, offering opportunities for both genders in academics, sports, and activities. The college also provides various facilities for students, including parking, , hostels, and a library. Gender-sensitive programs such as workshops on sexual harassment, National Girl Child Day, and Women's Day celebrations raise awareness of women's rights. The Student Council organizes events like the Annual Gathering and Cultural Days, contributing to leadership development and community spirit. While female student participation in cultural activities is high, there is room for improvement in sports and leadership roles, with recommendations to encourage more female involvement in sports, ensure 33% female representation in the Student Council, and raise awareness of women's legal rights.

Best Practices

Best Practice 1: Student-Centric Learning with Sustainable and Green Practices Integration

Title of the Practice: Student-Centric Learning with Integration of Sustainable and Green Practices

Objectives of the Practice: To inculcate sustainability principles in architectural education and develop innovative, well rounded, environmentally conscious architects.

The Context: The rising need for sustainability in architecture and the challenge of incorporating green practices into design education inspired this initiative.

The Practice: The curriculum integrates subjects like climatology, environmental studies, and sustainable cities and communities, green buildings. Practical applications include projects on rainwater harvesting, waste management, and energy-efficient design. The institution has a formal Green Policy under which it has an MoU with Ridoft, an organization dedicated to single use plastic waste collection and processing. Students actively participate in single use plastic waste management by using a mobile app of Ridoft, collecting single use plastic and PET bottles. This initiative is complemented by workshops, tree plantations, and heritage conservation projects, bridging theory with practical, real-world applications.

Evidence of Success: Students have demonstrated their commitment to sustainability by designing eco-friendly sculptures, recycling 52 kg of single-use plastic, and 116 kg of paper through campus initiatives. Furthermore, their thesis projects showcase innovative approaches to sustainable and green practices, reflecting environmentally conscious architectural solutions.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required: Expanding the practice beyond campus to the communities is challenging also in terms of wholehearted participation. Resources like funding for projects and workshops on emerging green technologies are crucial for implementation.

Best Practice 2: Promotion of Gender Equity and Inclusivity

Title of the Practice: Promotion of Gender Equity and Inclusivity

Objectives of the Practice: To create an inclusive campus culture and ensure equal opportunities for students of all genders and backgrounds.

The Context: Our students come from rural areas and diverse socio-economic backgrounds, which makes equity and inclusivity essential in their education. In architectural education, traditional gender biases and a lack of inclusivity can limit opportunities for growth and development. To ensure that every student, regardless of gender or background, can thrive, it is important to create a supportive and equitable learning environment.

The Practice: Yashoda College conducts gender audits, organizes sensitization programs, self-defence workshop for female students and also ensures universal design principles are integrated into design projects. Inclusive facilities like a common room for girls, flexible schedules, and maternity benefits for staff. Student projects and competitions emphasize gender-neutral design and teamwork which is inculcated in their learning process.

Evidence of Success: Increased female student participation in academic, Sports, Cultural events and extracurricular activities and greater awareness of gender issues among students and faculty also concepts of universal design in thesis projects highlight the success of this initiative.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required: Resistance to change in cultural mindsets and limited funding for specialized programs were initial hurdles. Partnerships with NGOs and resource allocation for gender sensitization programs proved essential.

Resource of Institute

The library has a total area of 150 Sq/m. A wide variety of reading materials is available, including books, bound volumes of periodicals, dissertations ,and non-print media like CDs, e-Books, and e-Journals. A total of 1305 reading materials, comprising 170 print books,766 e-books, and 59 bound volumes of journals and magazines, are housed at the library. The library has a total of 103 titles available. We subscribe to 85 e-journals. The library has 85 CDs in its collection. We subscribed 4 news papers & 136 e-news papers. We subscribed to Plagiarism Software also Book Scanner is housed at the Library,

The library is fully computerized and offers all readers' access to the OPAC. The library observes complete open access for all users.Library has an excellent digital library section with access to e-resources. The institute has AutoLib Software which is advanced integrated Library automation management software, is designed and developed by a team of Library & Information Science specialists, database designers, software developers and network specialists. It is fully integrated, versatile, user-friendly, cost-effective and multi-user & WEB enabled for Intranet, incorporating latest IT/WEB tools and techniques.





Objectives of gender audit:

The Gender Audit has the following objectives:

- 1. The institute shall take effective measures for the safety and security of all genders.
- 2. To find out the areas where gender balance exists and the factors behind the gender balance.
- 3. To establish good gender balance in decision-making processes in all areas of the college activities.
- 4. To suggest measures for bridging the gender gap.
- 5. To adopt gender equality in all aspects of college community.
- 6. To see the work and capacity for prevention of sexual harassment at the college.





Gender sensitive approach:

Gender sensitive approach aims at opening, reconstructing and broadening expectations and behavioral models related to gender. Gender sensitive structures respond equally to men and Women's specific interests without any presumption based on outdated views.

When gender became a major parameter for institutional governance, the institutional leaders stepped forward taking steps to ensure gender equality.

Gender Balance within the Institution:

Gender balance means the existence of a fair ratio of male and female representation within the institution in terms of number of students in the various programs as well as within the staff structure. The rationale is that traditionally women have lesser access to resources and opportunities due to the social structures which act as inhibitors to access. This results in lesser capability among women which in turn produces a snowball effect on their empowerment and access to development initiatives.

Gender Audit Team reviewed and analyzed the operating environment of Yashoda college of Architecture, Satara From the analysis; the team understood that the college is operating in an environment where everyone has access to a full range of opportunities to achieve the social, psychological and physical benefits that come from participating and leading in sports and physical activity. Gender equity requires that girls and women be provided with a full range of activity and program choices that meet their needs, interests and experiences.

Therefore, some activities may be the same as those offered to boys and men, some may be altered, and some may be altogether different. The college always concentrates on students' academic performance along with their overall personality development. Observing gender equality, the girls are provided with various facilities. The lectures of eminent personalities are held on various topics to develop their personality. Workshop for Prevention, Prohibition and redressal of sexual harassment of women at work place, National girl child day, National constitutional day for Highlighting the rights given to women by constitution, International women's day celebration etc. are organized in the last one years to make the women aware of their rights and responsibilities. Women are made aware of laws and by-laws by organizing lectures of eminent judges, lawyers, social workers etc. Anti-ragging Committee and Internal Complaints Committee have been formed in the college.

The analysis of the responses of students with regard to program planning and design in college and its activities revealed that most student members feel that the gender equity in policies, program of the college is adequate.






Table showing percentage of male and female teaching staff during last academic years.

Graph below showing number of male and female student in student council body



Graph below showing Female and Male student participation in Annual Gathering



Graph below showing Female and Male student participation in College Exhibition



Graph below showing Female and Male student participation in Annual Sports.




Graph below showing male and female student's participation in Zonal sports




Graph below showing Female and Male student participation in NASA convention



Conclusion:

The Gender Audit Team analyzed that the management and staff of the college encourage gender equality and gender sensitivity, demonstrating gendersensitive behavior. Gender equity goals and objectives are included in all the college's policies and programs. Staff members reported no problems related to gender criteria, and no complaints about gender issues have been received. The college has significant strengths and opportunities to good gender balance, supported by the increasing enrolment of girls. While there are some weaknesses, they can be addressed gradually through changes in the value system.

Findings:

- 1) Seats are not reserved for female students in the student council body.
- 2) Female students' strength is higher and has been continuously increasing.
- 3) In contrast, male students have a higher participation rate in sports compared to female students.
- Over the last academic years, female students not participated in zonal sports.
- 5) Their participation in the annual gathering and cultural activities is significantly higher than that of male students.

Recommendations:

- 1) Motivate and guide female students to participate in sports, both at the college and zonal levels.
- Ensure at least 33% female student participation in the student council body.
- Motivate male students to actively participate in the annual gathering and cultural days.
- Organize women empowerment programs and awareness sessions on legal rights for women.


